#### Year 6 SATs

The Y6 SATs are only **15** school days away (14<sup>th</sup> - 17th May 2018). If you have a child in Year 6, at the end of Key Stage 2, they will take national curriculum tests in English reading, English grammar, punctuation and spelling and mathematics.

The tests help measure the progress pupils have made and identify if they need additional support in a certain area. The tests are also used to assess schools' performance and to produce national performance data. The Key Stage 2 tests will be taken on set dates:

Monday 14 May 2018	English: Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling: Punctuation and grammar (including vocabulary)	
Tuesday 15 May 2018	English: Reading	
Wednesday 16 May 2018	Mathematics: Arithmetic Mathematical reasoning	
Thursday 17 May 2018	Mathematics: Mathematical reasoning	



At the end of the summer term you should receive test results for:

- English grammar, punctuation and spelling
- Mathematics

As there is no test for English writing, this will be reported as a teacher assessment judgement. This is a judgement teachers will make, based on your child's work at the end of Key Stage 2. You will also receive teacher assessment judgements for English reading, mathematics and science.

#### A Year 6 SATs breakfast Club will operate during SATs week.

During SATs week, Year 6 children will be asked to arrive early (8.15a.m.) for a healthy, hearty (and free) breakfast. This enables them to relax with their friends so they are ready to do their bests in the test.

Most tests will take place in the hall and children will be given time to relax and revise in the afternoons.

#### Parents can help leading up to the SATS week by :

Ensuring the children get into school every day and on time
Early nights Remind them about homework
Be positive Maximise additional lessons

Let the children know there is nothing to worry about

- · English reading
- Teacher assessment

#### How can you help your child to prepare?

Teachers will make sure all pupils in their class are prepared for the tests. There's nothing specifically test-related that you should do to prepare your child. You should follow the general advice above and that teachers have given about supporting your child's education throughout the year.

#### What do the tests look like?

We usually find that the children are very positive during the SATs week and enjoy demonstrating how much they have learned. Together, school and home can support them to "shine."

#### **End of Key Stage 1 - Year 2 National Tests**

Your child's teacher is responsible for judging the standards your child is working at in English, Maths and Science, by the end of Key Stage 1. To help inform those judgements, pupils sit national curriculum tests in English and Maths, commonly called SATs. They may also sit an optional test in English grammar, punctuation and spelling. The tests are a tool for teachers to help them measure your child's performance and identify their needs as they move into Key Stage 2. They also allow teachers to see how your child is performing against national expected standards. The tests can be taken any time during May and they are not strictly timed. Pupils may not even know they are taking them as many teachers will incorporate them into everyday classroom activities.

#### **Subject Test Papers:**

- English reading short text and questions
   Long text with separate questions
- Mathematics Arithmetic Mathematical reasoning
- English grammar, punctuation and spelling (optional test) Spelling Punctuation and grammar (including vocabulary)

Teachers will use the results from these tests, along with the work your child has done throughout the year, to help them reach their own judgements about how your child is progressing at the end of Key Stage 1. These teacher assessment judgements will be reported to you by the end of the summer term

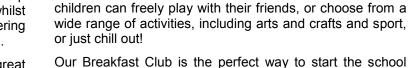
**Year 3 and 4 Magnificent Mathematicians** 

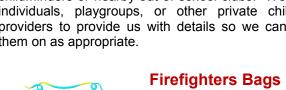

#### Walking Bus

The Shanklea Walking Bus is a scheme where parents can drop off (and collect at the end of the school day) their child at a meeting point, a short distance away from school. The children are accompanied by staff as they walk to school along a set route. The children walk in pairs and staff wear high visibility clothing. With

Shanklea Senior Leadership Team working a daily rota system, we have a "driver" at the front and a "conductor" at the back and the children are collected at "bus stops" at agreed times along the route. Walking Bus aims to help more children walk to school and to improve safety by reducing school gate congestion. Since it's powered by good old-fashioned leg work it promotes healthy lifestyles and by encouraging walking it also increases awareness of the local environment, independence and social opportunities. The meeting point is at the Masonic Lodge, just along the cycle path.
