We are delighted to announce that we have successfully maintained our **Sainsburys School** Games GOLD Award.



The School Games Mark is a Government led awards scheme launched in 2012 to reward schools for their commitment to the

development of competition across their school and into the community. The Gold Mark is a retrospective award which validates our success over this academic year. To achieve GOLD LEVEL, Shanklea had to :

- Enable all students to take part in two hours of physical education per week and have extra curriculum provision.
- Engage at least 50% of students in extracurricular sporting activity every week.
- Provide opportunities for both boys and girls to take part in the appropriate level of competitions.

Shanklea has exceeded targets and 90% of our Key Stage 2 children have joined Extra-curricular sporting clubs and 33% of students have taken part in leading, managing and officiating School Games

officiating School Games activities.
