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Transition Time

Transitioning from Nursery to Primary School and from Primary to Secondary School is a time of excitement and anxiety for both children and parents. New surroundings, new friends, new challenges, and new choices are all on offer as your child opens the door on the first days of school.

So, how can you help prepare them for the first day - and the years to follow - and make the transition easier for both of you?

Research by Oxford University has found that there are **five** key elements - in the eyes of a child - which constitute a positive transition:

- 1. They are able to develop new friendships and improve their self-esteem and confidence
- 2. They settle in to school life in a way that causes no concerns to their parents/carers
- They show an increased interest in school and school work
- 4. They get used to their new routines and school organisation with great ease
- 5. They experience curriculum continuity.

Attending open days and/or an orientation evening will help both of you come to grips with what is expected in the next year.

Remember Shanklea Primary School will hold a transfer taster day on the morning of **Thursday 4th July 2019**. Children will spend time with their new teacher and classmates. Year 6 children will spend the whole day at their next school.
