Pupil Premium Strategy

2017 - 2018

The pupil premium 2017/18 of £73,440 is therefore being spent in the following ways:

2 teachers to maintain small class sizes	£14,000 High quality first teaching and personalised support for Pupil Premium (PP) children should impact strongly upon attainment and progress. High quality next steps marking should set additional age and ability appropriate learning challenges for PP children.
Retention of ICT technician	£12,000 In class. Technical support for extra-curriculum enhancement via e-learning programmes for nurture, English and Maths. This will raise the attainment and progress of PP children in a disguised and engaging way.
TalkBoost programme and teaching assistant release to deliver phonics and mathematical programmes to support language development of children in EYFS/KS1; Speech and language/mathematical interventions; KS2 Specific subject interventions for lower ability Pupil Premium/SEND children	Read Write Inc programme £1,000 and TA release £2,000 – pre-tutoring opportunities to ease the application of basic skills in context
Teaching Assistants KS1 and KS2	£8,000 to scaffold and boost children self-esteem and resilience when tackling and applying real life problems to the primary curriculum
1:1 tuition in KS2	One to one tuition support for under attaining pupils and pupils whose progress needs to be accelerated £7500 initially
More able children boosters KS2;	£4,000 Increased frequency of challenges for all abilities/aspirational and empowerment
360 VLE 'I am Learning' and 'My Maths' – ICT Maths and English tuition, Mathletics and Spellodrome; Accelerad	£3,000 Additional stimuli to stretch, challenge and move children on to more demanding work
Lunchtime supervision support for vulnerable children - social, emotional well-being	£3,000 Improved early intervention and management of emotional and behavioural difficulties
KS2 Homework Club	£1,000 to provide greater challenge in a supportive environment for all disadvantaged students
Enrichment (Residential trip Y4, Y5 and Y6) subsidy;	£100 per child £5,700 to establish a strong, fully inclusive can-do culture
Ensure all PP children access 'memorable experience' trips, free milk, fruit and swimming	£3,000 Opportunities to remove barriers to future attainment and extend life experiences/ambitions
Music therapy and specialist instrumental – emotional support for under achieving pupils	£3,000 to promote resilience and self-esteem of pupils
Access to OOSC provision	£3,000 for extended childcare for Child Protection/Children in Need/LAC/Services pupils to support employment patterns and vulnerability
Workshops	£2000 Workshops with authors, mathematicians, scientists and business

	ambassadors to boost attainment and progress of the more able disadvantaged cohort – providing a motivation to read and write and calculate in situ
CPD- University links, programming algorithms, Lego Masters	£1240 specific staff training around mastery, working at greater depth and challenging the disadvantaged to meet inclusion and equality outcomes
