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### The appointment of an Inclusion Mentor at Shanklea Primary School

We are delighted to have appointed Mrs Young to support the needs of children who may be facing barriers to their learning and help them achieve to the very best of their abilities in our school. She will work with children, teachers, parents, carers, families, schools and other agencies to ensure children and families receive the support they need.

### What are barriers to learning?

A barrier to learning is any factor that prevents a child from being in a suitable mood or emotional, physical or psychological state to engage in their lessons and learn.

Barriers to learning experienced by children may be:

- Difficult relationships with friends
- Feeling vulnerable
- Low self-confidence
- Worries about transferring to secondary school
- Difficult family circumstances such as separation or a bereavement
- Young carers
- Difficulty in controlling emotions

With the consent of parents and carers, Mrs Young will help children, their families and teachers to identify particular difficulties a child maybe having and seek solutions. She will work with children on a 1:1 basis, in a small group or with a class to help improve the situation and encourage

pupils to re-engage in their learning.

The aim of this additional support is to help raise children's achievement and aspirations by improving:

- social skills
- friendship skills
- motivation
- attendance
- punctuality

The value of positive and active involvement by parents cannot be overstated and family support and engagement is highly valued by our school. Mrs Young will communicate with families regularly to update them and to get feedback on their thoughts and is available at various times throughout the week to chat with parents/carers.



If staff in school identify children who would benefit from time with our Inclusion Mentor, they will discuss this with parents first. However, if you as a parent/carer have concerns you can speak to Mrs Young directly.

Please feel free to come and chat with Mrs Young if you have any more questions. She will be on the playground before school most mornings.

### **Booking OOSC and Breakfast Club Sessions through School Gateway**

- 1. Login to School Gateway.
- 2. Select the club you want (Breakfast Club or Out of School Club)
- 3. From the session calendar, click on the session you would like to make bookings for. A running total of cost will be shown if there are charges for these sessions)

Please note: You will need to enter bookings for siblings separately (using the sibling rate option) to ensure you get the discounted rate.

- Click **Book** selected sessions. A confirmation 4. message will appear asking you to confirm. Click Book now to confirm your choices.
- Payment is due at the time of booking. Once you 5. have confirmed your booking you will be redirected to the payment screen.



Bookings can still be made using the booking forms outside the office.



We have been advised that the trial of parking restrictions around our school has been extended for a further six months. Parents are reminded that parking is prohibited everywhere on Nairn Road, Needham Place and Northolt Avenue. Parking control officers issued a lot of penalty notices to people parking in these areas during our last school year.
