


## Shanklea Superstars

### Supporting Your Child During Exam Time (Young Minds)

As we start to move towards exam season, Young Minds have launched advice for parents about supporting their children.

#### Tips include:

- Encourage your child to take revision breaks and find a balance between studying and doing things they find enjoyable and relaxing.
- Make sure they are eating and drinking at regular intervals.
- Reassure them – reinforce that you are and will be proud of them no matter what happens.
- Remain positive and hopeful!
- Let them know their feelings are valid and normal, but also offer support and solutions where possible.
- Anxiety is often worst at night and this means it is useful to encourage good bedtime routine

### Big Battery Hunt

Children will bring home a Big Battery Hunt Box template card this week. Please make it into a box and put any expired batteries into it over the next few weeks. We will ask you to bring the old batteries in the box during next term. There are more details in the letter shown on the left.

We hope everyone will join in this recycling project which not only helps the environment but could win us prizes too.



Dear Parents,

We have decided to launch a very exciting campaign called the Big Battery Hunt. In school your child will learn how important it is to recycle batteries and what happens when people don't.

Your child has been challenged to find and collect as many batteries as possible, please help them do this. They can be as creative as they like by going to work spaces, places of worship, local businesses and the wider community to enlist everyone to help make sure that no battery ends up in landfill.

Your child has been supplied with a collection box, please get them to bring this into school when it is full so that we can add it to the main container and enter the competition.

The competition ends on **Monday 3rd June**, so make sure your child brings in their batteries before then.

#### SAFETY INFORMATION

- Discarded batteries present a very small risk of fire and source of ignition. The risk can be greatly reduced by taking the following simple precautions:
  - Keep batteries dry and away from sources of heat
  - Do not put damaged batteries in the collection box
  - Store the box/batteries away from combustible or flammable materials
  - Do not put any items other than batteries in the collection box
- We are only collecting AAA, AA, C and D batteries for this activity, but please see guidance on alternative batteries:
  - Button cells present a choking / ingestion hazard – keep away from young children
  - Insulate (tape up) terminals on batteries that can easily short circuit (e.g. 9V batteries)
  - For leaking batteries place in a small plastic bag and then put in the collection box, or keep separate and take directly to an alternative recycling point
