## Breakfast and Out of School Club Extended Opening Hours: Introductory Offer

We are delighted to announce that, in response to parental requests, we will be trialling extended opening hours for our Breakfast and Out of School Clubs (OOSC).

The new system will come into effect from 3rd June and bookings may be made now. We reserve the right to discontinue the extra sessions or change the prices in future should this become necessary.

Breakfast Club will cover 2 sessions. The first session will run between 7.30am and 8am and will cost £2.25. The second session starts at 8am and will run as before.

OOSC will have an additional late session between 5.30 and 6pm to help those parents who have difficulty getting to school for 5.30pm.

Please note that our Caretaker secures the site at 6pm so if a child is not collected by then there will be an additional fee of £10 to cover our costs.

Year 6 Author visit

Children in Year 6 are going to meet author, Liz Flanagan, next Wednesday to hear about her new fantasy story -Dragon's Daughter.

## Year 3 and 4 are off to Segedunum

Children in Years 3 and 4 will visit Segedunum in Wallsend next week. Segedunum was a Roman fort at the eastern end of Hadrian's Wall near the banks of the River Tyne, and formed the eastern end of the wall. It was in use as a garrison for approximately 300 years, from around 122 AD, almost up to 400AD. The children will have a fantastic time exploring the site and taking part in workshops based on life in the fort and transport in Roman times.

### **Important Medical Information**

An inquest into the death of 13-year old boy who suffered a severe allergic reaction concluded this week. The coroner noted that there was a 'missed opportunity' at his school to inform other pupils of the boy's 'grave allergies'. The boy died after another child threw cheese at him in an 'immature' act which clearly did not mean to cause such harm.

The coroner said, 'the school's healthcare provision for the child was "inadequate" and a contributing factor in his death was the fact his allergy action plan was not included in the school's care plan or medical box.'

#### It is extremely important that allergies are reported to the School Office by parents or carers so medical needs are appropriately met. Please contact our Office Team if you have not already done so.

The guidance about EpiPens, and similar products, says that:

"children at risk of anaphylaxis should have their prescribed adrenaline auto-injector (AAI) (often known by the trade name 'Epipen') at school for use in an emergency. The Medicines and Healthcare Products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) recommends that those prescribed AAIs should carry TWO devices at all times, as some people can require more than one dose of adrenaline and the AAI device can be used wrongly or occasionally misfire.

Depending on their level of understanding and competence, children and particularly teenagers should carry their AAI(s) on their person at all times or they should be quickly and easily accessible at all times. If the AAI(s) are not carried by the pupil, then they should be kept in a central place in a box marked clearly with the pupil's name but NOT locked in a cupboard or an office where access is restricted.

It is not uncommon for schools (often primary schools) to request a pupil's AAI(s) are left in school to avoid the situation where a pupil or their family forgets to bring the AAI(s) to school each day. Where this occurs, the pupil must still have access to an AAI when travelling to and from school."

If the playground or field is considered too far, then it would be acceptable to have the AAI(s) held by a member of staff in a pouch or bag.
