It's been another busy week at Shanklea with lots of learning and laughter. Children and staff continue to work hard amidst the festive celebrations.

Early closure of schools and absences ahead of the end of term

We've had a number of queries from families about closing early for Christmas, particularly to avoid the possible need for staff and/or students to self-isolate during the Christmas holidays should they get the virus or become a close contact of a positive case.

The best place for children to be is in school, which is why the government said last week that there is no need for schools to close early for Christmas.

In a press release issued last week, the DfE said: "There remain no plans for schools to close early for Christmas, to extend the holidays or to implement rota systems." And the prime minister's plan has also said that schools should not close early.



The winter plan published by the Cabinet Office last week said: "Nurseries, schools and colleges should not change their Christmas holidays or close early this term. "Parents should continue to send their children to school during term time and students should continue to attend college right up until the end of term – our senior clinicians continue to advise that the best place for children and young people is in education.

A time-limited change to social restrictions over Christmas does not require any children to be taken out of school prematurely. The leaders and staff of education settings have been doing an extraordinary job to remain open, keep settings safe and provide education."

Northumberland County Council has advised that schools should remain open for face to face teaching until the end of the Autumn term. Following the latest tier announcement from the Government, the expectation from the Department for Education (DfE) is that schools are to remain open. Therefore, if you were to decide to withdraw your child/ren for the last week of term, this absence would be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Shanklea Primary School will close on **Friday 18th December 2020** and reopen to children on **Tuesday 5th January 2021**.


