Celebrations are in full swing at Shanklea Primary School as our students have received their fantastic test results. This year has seen the school achieve our best ever set of results in the different Key Stages.



In the past three years, the school has gone through a period of incredible change, and these results have further cemented the fact that we are heading in a very positive direction.

Our Head Teacher, Mrs Brown, states "I am incredibly proud of our students for these spectacular results; all their hard work has certainly paid off! A huge amount of credit is also due to our dedicated staff and governors who have worked closely with all students over the past 12 months to ensure they achieved their own personal goals. A specific thank you to our Chair of Governors, Mr Gareth Pearson, who works tirelessly to support the school team—all on a voluntary basis. My congratulations go to the students and my gratitude to staff and parents who have supported them so well in their preparations for these exams. **End of Reception Stage Tests 88%** of our children reached a good level of development. These are our best results ever and well above provisional national average!

**Year 1 Phonics Screening Test 92%** An amazing improvement and well above the national average!


**Year 2 Re-check Phonics Screening Test 94%** A massive improvement and well above provisional national average!



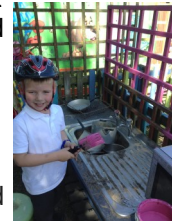
