Paint donation transforms outdoor spaces at Northumberland primary school

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Reception Maths Workshop


On **Tuesday 23rd October 2018**, **2pm** a Reception Maths Workshop will be held for parents and carers of children in our EYFS. The aim is to show parents how we teach maths at Shanklea, what objectives are covered in EYFS. We will also model some practical maths with the children so parents can see the resources we use in class. Any questions will hopefully be answered and a PowerPoint presentation will give parents some support in the methods we use to teach calculations at school. Parents can support children with many mathematical experiences in their home.

EYFS assessment of Number

Early Learning Goal - Maths	Early Learning Goal - Maths
Number - Expected	Number - Exceeding
