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IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Collection of children from school

If you have arranged for your child to be collected from school by someone other than the usual parent/carer who collects each day, it is imperative that you inform the school at the start of the day. In the case of an emergency, please telephone the school office and we can inform your child's teacher.

Bicycles and Scooters in the playground

It is wonderful that so many children are taking the healthy option of travel ing to school on their bicycles and scooters. However, for health and safety reasons, please could you ensure that your child dismounts at the school gate as the playground is so congested. All bicycles should be parked under the shelter and scooters "parked" in the rack and pods in the school grounds.

Dogs

Please can we remind all parents that dogs are not allowed in the school playground when dropping off and collecting your child or permitted close to the school gate. We would be really grateful if dog owners could refrain from tethering their dogs to the railings so that children are not frightened or tempted to pet them. We do have children with severe phobias who are very upset by even the friendliest of dogs.

Snacks

All children may bring a healthy snack (no crisps, sweets, biscuits or chocolate please) to be eaten during morning break. Snacks should not be left in lunch boxes but should instead be taken into class in the morning. As we are part of the 'Fruit and Veg' scheme, all EYFS and KS1 children are provided with a snack every day. Can we remind all parents that nuts are not allowed anywhere in school

Absences from School

You may have seen much discussion on the television and in the press this week about how schools respond when a child is absent from school without any reason given by parents or carers.

The safety and wellbeing of all children at Shanklea is paramount. If a child is unable to attend school for any reason we ask parents/carers to contact us immediately. This may be achieved by:

- Phoning school and leaving a message
- Texting school
- Emailing school
- Telling a member of staff if coming to school with another child.

If no reason for absence is received, our office team will send a text to the person(s) named as the primary contact. If no response is received, our staff will ring through the contacts list until a response is received.

In the rare instance where no response nor any other reason is received we will contact the appropriate authorities to ensure that all is well.

We greatly appreciate the support and co-operation of parents who work with us to ensure all systems operate smoothly and our children's wellbeing is ensured.
