

28 mins • O Once again, there are increasing parking problems around Shankles School. Parents, dropping off, or picking up, are ignoring the parking restrictions. Naim Road has residents parking permits, Northolt Ave and Needham Place is residents only parking. Cars are even being parked on footpaths and grass verges, causing considerable damage. Even an ambulance struggled to gain access to Northolt Avenue because of inconsiderate school parking. We have set a drop of and pick up point at the Masonic Lodge, in the village. With a walking bus to school. There is also the overflow car park off the roundabout, at the entrance to the estate.

Please show consideration to residents. are risking a £60 fine each time.

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# Parking Promise—Parking at Drop Off and Collection Times

Contortunately we are, once again, receiving calls from local residents about inconsiderate parking. Please see the screenshot opposite reporting complaints by local residents.

We would like to remind you of the Parking Promise that we ask you everyone in our Shanklea community to abide by.

Please remember:

• Parking across drives, even for a few minutes, can cause great frustration and distress;

Parking on the pavement makes it very difficult for people with buggies or disabilities;

- Parking on the pavement can be very dangerous as vehicles moving on the pavement are a hazard, especially for small children. It can force pedestrians to step into the road to get around a parked vehicle;
- Parking on corners prevents a clear view for those crossing the road;
- Parking, waiting or stopping to let passengers out on the Zig Zag lines is illegal outside school between 8am and 5pm;
- Parking, waiting or stopping to let passengers out on the Zebra Crossing is illegal;
- Parking in such a way as to prevent emergency vehicle access could be life threatening.

Shanklea Primary School has established a drop off and pickup point at the Masonic Lodge, in Cramlington Village, and operate a free Walking Bus to and from school.



#### **Running Late**

Being late for school has a negative impact on your child's learning.

Being just 10 minutes late every day adds up to an hour a week of lost learning. Over a year this adds up to one week of school missed in a year!

Being late for class often means important instructions are missed and the class is interrupted. Your child may feel uncomfortable and separate from peers.

Children need to arrive on time ready to settle into their school work.

Arriving at least 5 minutes before the first lesson allows your child to interact with their peers and their teacher and get themselves ready for their busy day.

Attending School regularly and arriving on time helps prepare children for the real world, where it is expected that they turn up to work every day and on time.

#### What if my child is sick?

Children will get sick and need to stay home occasionally. However, it is important that parents do not let children stay home unless they are truly sick.


Please keep in mind that complaints such as a stomach ache or headache can sometimes be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home. It is much better to talk to your child's teacher as soon as possible so we can work together in the best interests of the child.

Please do NOT send your child to school if they have a fever, diarrhoea, vomiting, a serious cough, rash, untreated conjunctivitis or a contagious illness e.g. chicken pox.

Always inform school if your child is absent due to illness, by text, phone call, or message, email or, if you are at school with another child, tell a member of staff.
