
Preventing Infection

Like many other schools in the North-East, Shanklea has been hit in recent weeks by higher than usual levels of flu-like illness, with possible links to norovirus infections. At the weekend we completed a 'deep clean' and disinfected the site after many staff and pupils were hit with vomiting, diarrhoea and flu-like symptoms. We have purchased more cleaning wipes (effective against norovirus and various bacteria) so that high levels of cleanliness can be maintained.

Norovirus is spread by coughing, sneezing and close contact, or touching the same surfaces. Regularly washing hands thoroughly using soap and water, especially before eating and after using the toilet, is the most efficient way to prevent it spreading.

Usually the virus will clear up in one to two days and sufferers are told to stay hydrated. If your child is unwell, it is important to stay away from school or work until they are better. If your child has had diarrhoea or vomiting then they should not return to school until 48 hours after they have symptom. If they have flu it is until they are feeling better.
