Safety around Shanklea

Parents are reminded that the roads around Shanklea (including Ringwood Drive and tributary roads across the cycle path) all have a 20mph speed limit.

We continue to receive complaints from local residents about inconsiderate parking (such as blocking pavements and drives) and dangerous driving (such as too fast near children). Can all parents and carers **PLEASE** drive slowly and park with consideration for others in our community.

There have also been some near misses with cycles on the cycle path near to school. Our School Council have written to the learning Village to ask their students to cycle a little more slowly and carefully near our school, particularly around young children. We have also been asked to remind everyone that it may be safer for pedestrians to keep to the footpaths and cyclists to the cycle paths.

Finally, can we remind everyone that whilst the road in front of school is generally quiet it IS still a road. We discourage movement of vehicles from the car park at pupil drop off and collection times but this does occasionally occur. PLEASE stay near small children at all times. Thank you.

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Fancy Feet Challenge

Shanklea will be taking part in a new challenge with Schools Go Smarter to encourage children to travel actively to school (walking, cycling and scooting) - to help keep them fit and healthy (and compete with other schools.)

Schools Go Smarter is a programme of activity which encourages pupils and parents across Tyne and Wear, Northumberland and Durham, to travel sustainably on their journeys to school each day. Throughout the Fancy Feet Whirly Wheels Challenge, by travelling actively to school at least once a week, each child will earn points.

As well as the children keeping active and having fun, our school will get the chance to win one of three fabulous prizes, with the first prize worth £1000. The Challenge is totally inclusive, so even if your child has to come to school by car, they can still gain points if they Park and Stride.

The Fancy Feet Whirly Wheels Challenge will run for four weeks from Monday 27th February 2017.



Big Pedal 2017 Cycle or Scoot Around the World in 10 days!

The Big Pedal is the UK's largest inter-school cycling and

scooting challenge that inspires pupils, staff and parents to choose two wheels for their journey to school.

Powered by Sustrans and funded by the Bike Hub, the 2017 challenge will run from Monday 20th to Friday 31st March 2017 and is open to individual classes as well as whole schools.

On each day of the challenge schools compete to see who can record the greatest number of pupils, staff and parents cycling or scooting to school. A school's best five days will determine their final position, but they can log journeys on all ten days if they wish.

For schools unable to take part in the main challenge we also have a one-day version, which can include cycling and scooting activities in the school day as well as on the journey to school.

To celebrate the finale of the challenge there is also the option to join our superhero fundraising day.

All schools will be entered into daily prize draws for rewards including bike and scooter stunt shows, equipment and storage if over 15% of your school cycle or scoot on each day of the challenge. Prize details will be announced on The Big Pedal website.
