Weekly Newsletter

We are excited about the prospect of reuniting our school community again 'in person;' we are really looking forward to seeing your children learn and thrive in their lessons and break-times at school again in the lead up to Christmas.

Despite the National Lockdown, we are confident that Shanklea Primary School will be able to sustain safe, risk reducing routines by continuing to work in close partnership together with you all. As you are aware, our School Risk Assessment is continually revised and updated to ensure that we are operating on site as safely as possible; it is shared with you on the school website and we will advise you of any changes in our weekly newsletter.

Collection and Drop-off Arrangements

Students are encouraged to walk or cycle to school, wherever possible. Adults choosing to drive their child to school are strongly advised to choose a safe drop off or pick up point well away from the school site boundary; the Masonic Hall car park on School Lane is only a few minutes walk from the school and is completely free of charge. This is for collection and drop-off only and the gates are unlocked between 8.30-9.30am and 2.30-3.45pm.

Please do not endanger the safety of the vast majority of students walking onto the school site by parking or dropping off in unsafe places, for example on Nairn Road or mounting the pavements along the front of the school site. Please remember that parking restrictions apply on the streets around our school (Nairn Road, Needham Place and Northolt Avenue) and parking enforcement officers patrol the area regularly and issue fines for parking without a permit.

We must insist that all students follow staff instructions regarding our Covid-19 safety measures so that we can ensure a safe working environment for all of our community.

We ask that parents make arrangements so that a **trusted adult is within 20 minutes of the school during the school day** to collect their child quickly from school if they become **unwell** or if they are **unable to behave safely** on site.

We will also expect parents to follow government guidance by **keeping their child at home if they are unwell** and by **seeking a test promptly** for all members of the household if any member of the household or



















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support bubble exhibits Covid-19 symptoms. Please **let us know immediately** if anyone in your household is self-isolating so that we are fully informed and are able to take appropriate decisions to keep the whole school community as safe as possible.

Please ensure that children are wearing **school appropriate footwear every day** as children often go onto the school field so that we maintain social distancing whilst maximising outdoor play and learning opportunities.

Many of the children enjoy a mid-morning snack. Please remember this should just be a **small healthy snack** such as a piece of **fruit**.

Please ensure your child brings:

- A book bag (older children may need a rucksack)
- Hand sanitizer if your child needs to have a specific one
- Labelled water bottle (pre-filled with water)
- A coat labelled with your child's name (students will be outside a lot)
- Robust, waterproof footwear
- If your child has a packed lunch, please bring this in a disposable bag whenever possible

School Lunches

The government is encouraging all schools to promote healthy eating and provide healthy, tasty and nutritious food and drink and to support children to develop healthy eating habits. We know about the links between living with obesity in childhood and adulthood, and the benefits to children's attainment and development of eating a balanced diet. It has, therefore, never been more important to ensure that children are eating healthy, nutritious meals at school and, in doing so, are building an understanding of the importance of healthy choices that supports their development now and in the future.

Many schools have stopped providing hot lunches and October saw the launch of **Hot'ober**, led by LACA, (the organisation representing school food providers) which aims to encourage schools and pupils to get back to eating hot and nutritious school lunches. As key workers throughout the pandemic, our school catering team are best placed to continue to deliver hot, nutritious meals safely and ensure School Food Standards are upheld.

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
campaign to encourage pupils and parents back to school meals. Further information can be found on LACA's website:

Drinking Water

Schools are legally obliged to provide access at all times to free drinking water on the school premises. We need to consider the most appropriate way to do this safely. Children should bring in a labelled water bottle every day, ideally a refillable one rather than single-use plastics which have negative environmental impacts.

Reception Starters- September 2021



The online portal for parents to apply for September 2020 Reception places is now open on the Northumberland County Council website.

If you have not used the portal before you will need to register as a new user. You can access more information by following the link above. Please note that you must complete an **online application** with Northumberland County Council (not school) for a place in the Reception class even if your child already attends Nursery provision. The closing date for applications is 15th January 2021. It is important to apply before this deadline as late applications could result in your child not being allocated the school of your choice.

Payments to School via the School Gateway

Please note that SchoolComms are changing their payment processor from 25th November 2020. The only change for Shanklea families will be that all bank transfer payments and direct debits will say "ParentPay" rather than "School Gateway". You do not need to change any settings. All bank transfer payments made through School Gateway will continue to be fully protected by the Direct Debit Guarantee.

Borrow Box Digital Library

We all know the importance of reading but we have to be mindful of Covid-19 risk reducing protocols too. Did you know that Northumberland Library has a digital library that can be accessed all the time?

This contains eBooks and eAudiobooks for both adults and children and is a **free service**. If people are not

Safe and Sparkly Bonfire Night Celebrations

Northumberland Fire and Rescue Service (NFRS) is encouraging residents to plan ahead and enjoy the Bonfire Night celebrations safely and responsibly.

Top 10 safety tips:

- Avoid wearing loose clothing or clothing that is labelled 'highly flammable'
- Always wear gloves when handling sparklers and fireworks
- Always have buckets of water ready to put out small fires or to cool sparklers
- Make sure children are supervised around fireworks and bonfires at all times
- Never drink alcohol if you're setting off fireworks
- Keep animals indoors and close curtains
- Only buy fireworks that are sold by a licensed seller
- Follow instructions carefully and light fireworks at arm's length
- Ensure spectators stand back from fireworks
- Never go back to a firework after it has been lit even if it hasn't gone off

NSPCC Speak out. Stay safe online programme

I am pleased to tell you that this term we will be participating in the NSPCC's *Speak out. Stay safe*. online

















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programme. *Speak out. Stay safe.* is a safeguarding programme available to all primary schools in the UK and Channel Islands and consists of an online assembly and supporting classroom based activities. It aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse in a child friendly, interactive way. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a trusted adult or **Childline**.

This online version of the *Speak out*. *Stay safe*. programme will help to overcome some of the challenges that the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic has presented in relation to having external speakers in school.

In the online assembly, the *Speak out*. *Stay safe*. messages continue to be delivered in a fun and interactive way with the help of their mascot Buddy as well as special guest appearances from Ant and Dec.

We have studied the content of the materials and are extremely confident that they are appropriate for primary-school-aged children. By the end of the programme, we're convinced children will feel empowered – knowing how they can speak out and stay safe.
