

Anti-bullying workshops

Our Anti-Bullying workshops introduced Key Stage 2 pupils to themes of identity and respect. Dave Burns taught us that all our identities matter, R.E.S.P.E.C.T. using engaging drama techniques to encourage pupils to explore what makes them, and the others around them, unique.

Bullying was explored on many levels from power to empowerment, what the word bullying means, strategies for dealing with bullying, building confidence and assertiveness skills. The sessions were fun, energising and powerful and utilised a fusion of styles including role-play, games, improvisation and discussion.

Little Monkeys Toddler group

Our Little Monkeys Toddler Group is held on Wednesday mornings, 9-10am during term time and is going from strength to strength. The group is run by Shanklea Primary School staff for the local community and we welcome parents, grandparents and carers with under 5s to meet, chat and play.

Children (and adults) can enjoy painting, play-dough, sticking activities, and a range of books and toys. For the last 20 minutes there is a 'circle time' with percussion instruments and singing.
