Even though rates of infection have dropped significantly, we are still working hard to stay Covid-safe, maintaining all previous safety measures in school; including frequent cleaning, handwashing and working in bubbles. All existing staggered times and entrances have remained the same and we are also still asking adults to wear face coverings on school premises. As and when we receive any further guidance from the Local Authority regarding any relaxation of these measures, we will update our risk assessment accordingly and keep you informed.



We continue to promote good hygiene practice throughout the day and everyone washes or sanitises their hands regularly. We are grateful to Mrs Hagan who, as PHSE co-coordinator, has managed to arrange delivery of free Lifebuoy hand sanitisers for all KS2 children. These are safe for them to use with adult supervision and should help to keep them safer when they are out and about.

It's great to see our children and families being healthy and using bikes and scooters as transport to school. However, we need to ensure that this is done **safely**, especially on roads and on the school site.

- Parents and carers MUST supervise children closely when bringing them into, or collecting them from, school.
- Please do not allow children to run around or play on verges or equipment and please exit the site as soon as possible.
- **DO NOT** let them drive their bike down grass banks, playground areas, ramped access areas or wheel the bike down steps.



Please also ensure that you stick to our one way system during these Covid times.

It is so important that we all continue to do our bit to keep everyone safe. Your support is greatly appreciated.

Reading is fun

We would like to say a big thank you to all the families who are supporting us with the home reading systems, allowing us to provide books in a Covid secure manner. It has been great to see the children demonstrating their enthusiasm for reading after this tricky time.

Even as your child grows older and begins to read more independently, reading together can remain a special time for families. Sharing a story with their classes remains many of our teachers and pupils favourite part of the day right up to Year 6. However it can be useful and fun to continue conversations after the books have been closed.

A few tips for doing this are shown on the right.

Operation Rescue Lilly Hoglet

The Nursery children found a young hedgehog in their play area on Tuesday. We watched the hedgehog from a distance first and left it alone, but it soon became clear that the hedgehog was in need of rescuing.

Mrs Blackett safely caught and handled the spiky hedgehog then, wearing thick gloves, gently placed it into a secure cardboard box with ventilation holes, lined with a towel. We handled the animal as little as possible to keep the hedgehog wild. We kept the hedgehog warm and quiet until a lady from the Northumbrian Hedgehog Rescue Trust came to collect it. We were told that the hedgehog was female so one of the children, Darcie, suggested the name 'Lilly Hoglet'.


Shanklea Forest



National survey of children, The Big Ask

The new Children's Commissioner for England, Dame Rachel de Souza, has launched The Big Ask – the largest ever consultation with children aged 4 to 17 in England. It aims to find out children's concerns and aspirations about the future, so that we can put children at the heart of our country's recovery from the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak.

A range of <u>teaching resources</u> have also been produced, including lesson plans and activity packs, to help teachers incorporate this into their lessons.

The results from this survey will help the Children's Commissioner identify the barriers preventing children from reaching their potential, put forward solutions and set ambitious goals for the country to achieve.

Travelling safely

It is likely that the roads and public transport system will now be busier than when students returned in March, given other businesses have reopened so the Department for Education has asked schools to pass on the following information on how pupils can travel to and from school safely:

- if you live a short distance from your school or college, walk, cycle or scoot to and from school wherever it is possible and safe to do so
- avoid sharing a car with anyone outside of your household or support bubble
- if you are using public transport to get to school or college, plan ahead and allow more time for your journey
- when you are travelling by public or dedicated school transport, don't forget to:
 - wear a face covering (unless you are exempt including if you are aged 11 and under). It is
 important you wear them for the entirety of your journey, including inside a bus or train station
