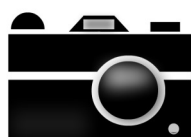
Parents and carers will be able to book their appointment to see their child's teacher from next week. Teachers will be available between 3.45 and 5.45 on:

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Administering Medicines in School

At Shanklea Primary School, we follow strict procedures (in accordance with DfE guidelines) to ensure the health and safety of everyone in our community.

If any child has a long term medical condition (including allergies) then we ask parents/carers to complete a healthcare plan. To ensure these are kept as up-to-date as possible we will be asking families of children with known needs to complete new forms. **If your child does not already have a Healthcare Plan and you think they should please contact us as soon as possible.**

We can give medicine for short term ailments if it is needed 4 times a day. Please bring the medicine to the office where you will be asked to complete a form. **Children should not be in charge of medicines at any time.**



Christmas Cards

Children have been busy already completing their Christmas designs. You might hear them referred to as Cauliflower Cards. This is an opportunity to buy personalised Christmas cards and/or gifts for family and friends.
