If any child has a long term medical condition (including allergies) then we ask parents/carers to complete a healthcare plan. To ensure these are kept as up-to-date as possible we will be asking families of children with known needs to complete new forms. If your child does not already have a Healthcare Plan and you think they should please contact us as soon as possible.

We can give medicine for short term ailments if it is needed 4 times a day. Please bring the medicine to the office where you will be asked to complete a form. Children should not be in charge of medicines at any time.

Bookings for November are now open. Please book by Wednesday 23rd October to avoid late fees.


Harvest Festival Celebrations Friday 11th October
