### **Parents Evening**

We will be hosting an additional parents' evening on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> November 2016, 3.30-6.00p.m. so that an individualised action plan for any child with special educational needs, a

We aim to involve parents in a structured and systematic way to shape the support their child receives and to be more transparent about what the school can provide.

We place an emphasis on working with parents to agree and review the outcomes the support is intended to achieve rather than merely counting the hours or resources given to a child at our school.

Specific parents will be individually invited and advised when appointments can be booked on the School Gateway.

### Flu Programme 2016

Flu is a problem every winter in the UK and is a key factor in winter pressures. It impacts on those who become ill, the NHS services that provide direct care, and on the wider health and social care system that supports people in at-risk groups.



The Flu vaccination remains the best way to protect people from flu. The national flu immunisation programme has been extended to offer flu vaccination to all **two to four year olds** and all children in school years 1,2 and 3.in 2016/17

On **Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2016**, NHS staff will come into school to vaccinate children in years 1, 2 and 3 whose parents have completed consent forms.

Vaccinating children each year means that not only are the children protected, but also that transmission across the population is reduced, lessening the overall burden of flu. Implementing this programme is therefore an important contribution to increasing resilience across the system through the winter period.
