Welcome back to the full re-opening of Shanklea Primary! It has been a fantastic start and lovely to have the children back. It is obvious that they want to be here with their teachers and their friends, they're enjoying the routine and structure of school, and they are really engaging with their learning in such a positive way.



We have been so excited about seeing everybody together once again after what can only be described as a very long absence and at quite a distance!

I just wanted to take a moment to thank parents and carers for their wonderful support this week. Our aim has been to provide as 'normal' an education as possible for our children, taking into account both their physical and emotional well-being, while also trying to ensure that they still access a broad and balanced curriculum, including specialist teachers.

I believe that Shanklea staff have done an excellent job ensuring that we maintain a high quality of education whilst adhering to the restrictions with which we have been presented. Life in classrooms still contains a buzz of excitement, chatter of children, strong and positive relationships between adults and children, and there is so much fantastic learning going on.

The staff have been looking at many ways to help children close any learning gaps that have developed as a result of lockdown and to support them emotionally.

It is hard to believe that almost a year ago, we were heading towards a first national lockdown – it has been a very long year! However, the **support and resilience of our school family has been amazing**. Our children, parents and staff have all worked so hard to ensure the **best possible learning continues** whether at home or in school.

Well done to all our children working both remotely and in school. I am so proud of you all.

It is important families adhere to the start/end of day times and the drop off/collection points. Please ensure you wear your mask as you enter the school site and follow the one-way system around the school. Minimal contact between families and bubbles is still needed to ensure the safety of all. Please help us all by following our risk reduction guidelines -having finally been able to have our children back we want to ensure we can stay fully open!



We appreciate that there will continue to be some anxieties about returning to school after we have gone through such an unprecedented and challenging year. But please be assured we have a rigorous risk assessment in place to keep everyone as safe as possible. It is important to note that there is a mandatory attendance expectation in all year groups.

















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Our staff are keen to have some 'normality' and the prospect of having our children return to the classroom for the remaining year is wonderful. The well-being and mental health of our pupils remains paramount, so we have planned some PSHE lessons alongside special English projects next week.

Please ensure your children regularly bring back their reading books and any school devices they have borrowed.

The Senior Leadership Team have also been reviewing our Covid-19 risk assessment to ensure that clear systems of control remain in place. As in the autumn term, we will continue to have a contingency plan in case of bubble outbreaks and communicate those changes to parents as soon as possible. Staff will continue to wear face coverings when in communal areas of the school buildings and will remind children to wash their hands regularly.

Free School Meals

Now that all pupils have returned to face-to-face teaching, all children are able to access a tasty, nutritious meal at school. These meals are free to those who are eligible for free school meals, including **Universal Free School Meals** for children in **Reception**, **Year 1** and **Year 2**.

The government also has a scheme to support individuals, families and children with food and other essentials outside of term-time through the COVID Winter Grant Scheme, which will operate through the Easter holidays. This scheme, run by local authorities, operated successfully in the Christmas and February half-term holidays and ensures that families and children who require it, including those eligible for means tested free school meals, can

















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receive the support they need. Eligible families will receive Hugg vouchers as before.


Get a test and stay at home
