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
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## **Menus**

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## **Punctuality**

When pupils arrive late, they miss out on essential instructions given at the beginning of the lesson. This can significantly reduce achievement, regardless of academic ability. Your child may also feel awkward arriving to the classroom when everyone else is settled. Furthermore, when one pupil arrives late, it can disrupt the entire class and the teacher – everyone's education can be compromised.

If a pupil arrives at school after the registers have closed without an adequate reason, we have to record this as an unauthorised absence. The **Education Welfare Officer** regularly checks the registers and takes referrals for pupils with irregular school attendance, which includes lateness.

During the **3 days** we were at school last week, there were the following number of cases of children arriving late without a legitimate reason (e.g. medical appointment):
