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#### Shanklea Remembrance

The children of Shanklea Primary School went the extra mile to mark Remembrance Day 2019 with their wonderful display of more than 500 poppies dedicated to those who have lost their lives in the line of duty.

What was different this year was the ingenious method the children used to create a unique Remembrance display. The Friends of Shanklea kindly funded art and craft supplies, so every child in school could make a poppy, and the papier-mâché tree, which created a wonderful cascade of poppies.

Pupils, staff and families also created a spectacular and moving tribute to commemorate the end of past hostilities through their own designed poppies which honoured relatives and their stories.

We upheld the tradition of commemorating Remembrance with a respectful and thought-provoking assembly. Amelia's grandad brought a gramophone into school and animatedly told the children about life in the trenches. A surviving vinyl disc played a musical tune in a moving homage for those who sacrificed their lives in war.

The children gave beautiful and moving musical performances of two touching hymns, accompanied by a montage of images, artefacts and documents as a poignant reminder of war and loss. We all took the opportunity for some quiet reflection.
