Dear Parents and Carers

Weekly Newsletter

We ask all parents who send their children to Shanklea Primary to support our school uniform policy. We believe that parents and guardians have a duty to send their children to school correctly dressed and ready for their daily schoolwork. This includes ensuring that their child has the correct uniform, and that it is clean, in good repair and of appropriate fit.

Please support our positive school image and ensure that all children abide by this uniform policy. This includes no nail varnish or extreme hairstyles.

P.E. is a statutory part of the curriculum and children are entitled to 2 hours of P.E. each week from KS1 upwards.

It is compulsory that children have their PE kit in school.

Every pupil must be fully equipped with the required P.E. kit for every lesson. Our uniform policy states that: 'The school has adopted the following uniform for P.E. lessons:

- A white t-shirt
- A pair of black shorts
- A pair of black pumps / black trainers
- During winter months, children may wear a pair of black jogging bottoms and a black jumper/ Shanklea Hoodie.'

Throughout school, there are some children who regularly forget their P.E. kits and this is having a detrimental effect on their learning as it may be that they cannot participate without the correct clothing.

We also have numerous children throughout school who are trying to do their P.E. lesson in school shoes. This is a serious health and safety risk and can result in serious slips, trips and falls.

Participation in P.E. lessons is monitored; therefore if a pupil does not have the required kit or cannot remove earrings, then this will result in an initial verbal reminder to the child, followed by a letter to parents/carers if the reminder proves to be unsuccessful.

Children who bring their P.E. kits every week will be rewarded with Castle Points.

Children can only wear small plastic stud insert earrings to school for newly pierced ears. Parents/carers are encouraged to only allow their child's ears to be pierced at the start of the summer holidays so that they have

















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time to heal before returning to school. For their safety of **ALL** children, **NO** other jewellery (i.e. bracelets/necklaces) are allowed to be worn at school.

If your child does come to school in jewellery (other than small plastic stud inserts) please be advised that they will be asked to remove it, and staff will keep it safe until the end of the day when you can collect it.

Reading

It has been pleasing to see the pupils starting to enjoy the new reading books that have been purchased this year and regain some normality in their learning. To ensure we are able to continue to send books home we ask that all parents continue to support the school systems that are in place to limit the risk of transmission.

They are as follows:

- Pupils in all classes will receive a book to take home each Monday
- This should be kept at home throughout the week
- Books <u>must</u> be returned to school on a Friday

Returned books will be left over the weekend (72 hours) before being returned into circulation.

Unfortunately, therefore, at this time we are not able to receive books into school during the week as this will not support our health and safety systems.

If you are looking for ways to enjoy reading with your child there are many authors that have interesting websites and games and activities about books they may have read.

Computing and Remote Learning

The coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic presents an unprecedented challenge for our school system and the traditional approach to delivering education. The impact of the pandemic has necessitated many pupils being out of school, and this will continue to be the case for some pupils, in line with the legal requirements and guidance in place to tackle the virus.

Shanklea Primary School has responded to this with a strong and proactive commitment to providing remote education, in these challenging and uncertain circumstances.

From Thursday 22nd October 2020, the Government has made it a legal duty legal for parents, teachers and schools to provide remote education for state-funded, school-age children who are unable to attend school due to COVID-19.

Remote education expectations

Where a class, group or a small number of pupils need to self-isolate, or local restrictions require pupils to remain at home, the Government expects schools to have the capacity to offer immediate remote education.

















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Schools are expected to consider how to continue to improve the quality of their existing curriculum, for example through technology, and have a strong contingency plan in place for remote education provision by the end of October 2020. This planning will be particularly important to support a scenario in which the logistical challenges of remote provision are greatest, for example where large numbers of pupils are required to remain at home.

In developing these contingency plans, the Government expects schools to:

- use a curriculum sequence that allows access to high-quality online and offline resources and teaching videos and that is linked to the school's curriculum expectations
- give access to high quality remote education resources
- select the online tools that will be consistently used across the school in order to allow interaction, assessment and feedback and make sure staff are trained in their use
- provide printed resources, such as textbooks and workbooks, for pupils who do not have suitable online access
- recognise that younger pupils and some pupils with SEND may not be able to access remote
 education without adult support and so schools should work with families to deliver a broad and
 ambitious curriculum

When teaching pupils remotely, schools are expected to:

- set assignments so that pupils have meaningful and ambitious work each day in a number of different subjects
- teach a planned and well-sequenced curriculum so that knowledge and skills are built incrementally, with a good level of clarity about what is intended to be taught and practised in each subject
- provide frequent, clear explanations of new content, delivered by a teacher in the school or through high-quality curriculum resources or videos
- gauge how well pupils are progressing through the curriculum, using questions and other suitable tasks and set a clear expectation on how regularly teachers will check work
- enable teachers to adjust the pace or difficulty of what is being taught in response to questions or assessments, including, where necessary, revising material or simplifying explanations to ensure pupils' understanding
- plan a programme that is of equivalent length to the core teaching pupils would receive in school, ideally including daily contact with teachers

















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In the younger years, families will be able to access digital learning through Tapestry and from Year 1 through to Year 6 Google Classroom.

A Google Classroom leaflet will be sent home shortly with lots more information on how to access learning at home. If you have any problems, please contact your child's teacher via email or contact our Office Team.
