### Guidance on school Closure due to Adverse Weather Conditions or Other Unforeseen Circumstances

Schools are obliged to open for 190 days per year. Decisions to close school are, therefore, only taken when the safety or welfare of the pupils at school or travelling to school is likely to be adversely affected.

Head teachers are advised to keep schools open wherever possible and must explore other options before deciding to close school. Therefore, school is only likely to close in the event of severe weather conditions or other unforeseen circumstance.

If it was decided necessary to close school, Shanklea parents would be advised as soon as possible using the following methods:
