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
Years 5 and 6 Performances

End of Year Disco Cancellation due to the Police Commissioner Elections but School Stays Open

If you live close to school, you may have already received your polling card for the Police Commissioner election which will be held on Thursday 18th July.

On this occasion, we have successfully appealed against the instruction to close school so that it may be used as a polling station. We have had to close school twice already this academic year and are acutely aware of the disruption and inconvenience this can cause to families.

For this election only, we have made arrangements with the Election Office to use our Community Room with officers in position to ensure safeguarding procedures are appropriately managed. We have been advised that we would be unable to stay open during elections with expected higher turnouts.

Sadly, however, this means that we are unable to hold our planned disco on that night and we have been unable to find a suitable date to reschedule to at this late stage. We are sorry if anyone disappointed.
