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














This week the school has been alive with Science activities and experiments linked to books. These have ranged from alien invasions to "who dunnit" style crime solving!



In Early Years the children have focussed their work around "The Hungry Caterpillar". They have explored the life cycle of a butterfly, observing real life caterpillars and how they develop. They have also studied eating habits and learnt more about how they should follow a healthy diet.



In Years 1& 2 an alien crash landed on Earth! The children have been following the book "Beegu" and investigated where Beegu came from. After this the classes have been designing and building spacecraft suitable to send the marooned alien back home.



Children in Years 3 & 4 have been reading the book "One Plastic Bag" and have completed a variety of activities centred around recycling. They have learnt more about which materials can be recycled and ultimately created new products using old materials.



In Years 5 & 6 the children have studied "The Head is Dead", a gruesome mystery thriller filled with unspeakable deeds. The children have then been trying to solve who did the crime using forensic techniques including finger printing, chromatography and acidity tests.
